# Effective Presentation skills – The Role and Qualities of a good Presenter

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## The Role of the Presenter...

The role of a presenter is to communicate with the audience and control the presentation





## The Role of the Presenter...

Preparation, planning, structure, design, delivery, great images, skilful use of media and a strong script

• Important - But not everything

When it comes to an effective presentation, one of the most important elements are YOU





## The Role of the Presenter...

A presenters qualities and personal style/approach are as important as the actual content of the presentation itself





## **Qualities of a good Presenter**

### Enthusiasm

• Convey controlled enthusiasm for your subject

### Humour

- Provide variety and relief novelty and uniqueness increases impact
- Use appropriately and in good taste



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## **Qualities of a good Presenter**

### Confidence

- Stems from Subject Knowledge/Job
- Knowledge/Experience and Preparation Radiate confidence without preaching

### Manner

• Fair/Firm/Friendly

### Simplicity

- Simple language/accurate diction and correct
- pronunciation
- Short and sweet



## **Qualities of a good Presenter**

Additional actions

- Focus on the Individual: Develop the skill of speaking not to "an audience" but to its individual members
- Build Suspense: Not every topic is going to lend itself to this technique, you should try to keep the audience anticipating what's next, and save the best for last, when appropriate
- **Be Bold:** add stories, anecdotes, testimonials, analogies and demonstrations



## **Personal Factors**

- When you give a presentation, it is important to remember the whole package
- This includes how you present yourself as well as how you present the material





## **Personal factors**

### Eye contact

• Is your primary tool for establishing audience involvement

#### Voice and Tone

- Be loud enough to be easily heard
- Speak slowly and make use of pauses to stress important ideas
- Use a confident tone
- Avoid a dull or monotonous tone





## **Personal factors**

### **Body Language/Expressions/Gestures**

• Use them naturally – do what is natural to you





#### **Avoid distractions/mannerisms**

- Jingling change in your pocket
- Shifting from one foot to the other

#### **Keep control**

• Be calm and collected at all times

#### Appearance

• Clothes
